Be It Ordained by the City Council of the City of Chicago:

SECTION 1. The City Council finds that the areas described in Sections 2 through 4 of this ordinance are adversely affected by the over-concentration of businesses licensed to sell alcoholic liquor within and near the areas.

SECTION 2. Section 4-60-023 of the Municipal Code of Chicago is hereby amended by replacing subsection 4-60-023 (33.5), which was previously deleted as shown in the *Journal of the Proceedings of the City Council of the City of Chicago* of December 15, 2005 at page 40216, with the following underscored text:

4-60-023 (33.5) On Kedzie Avenue, from Montrose Avenue to Berteau Avenue.

Section 4-60-023 of the Municipal Code of Chicago is hereby amended by replacing subsection 4-60-023 (33.16), which was previously deleted as shown in the *Journal of the Proceedings of the City Council of the City of Chicago* of July 24, 2013 at page 58052, with the following underscored text:
